



## Tips and Observations for using Fungicides in conjunction with Mycorrhizae

### General Observations:

- The longer the wait to apply any fungicide after mycorrhizal fungi inoculation, the better for the mycorrhizal fungi development.
- Most foliar sprays of any fungicide (except systemics such as Bayleton) have little to no effect on Mycorrhizal Fungi.

### Tip for how to more safely apply the two in conjunction with one another:

#### Example Situation:

A Industry Professional (farmer/ landscaper, etc) who wants to inoculate his/her plants, but also uses a fungicide listed to be “harmful” to mycorrhizae per our Fungicide List, a couple times a year...

1. Apply Fungicide and wait 1 month
2. Apply Mycorrhizae
3. Give Mycorrhizae time to germinate (approx. 6 weeks)
4. When the fungicide is relied after this time period, you will temporarily lose external filaments. However, because they have already had a chance to establish themselves internally, after a short period they will reproduce those external filaments that were lost.
